

REGULATION RESPECTING THE LEGAL AUTHORIZATIONS TO PRACTICE THE PROFESSION OF PHYSICIAN OUTSIDE QUEBEC GIVING ACCESS TO THE PERMIT AND SPECIALIST'S CERTIFICATE OF THE COLLÈGE DES MÉDECINS DU QUÉBEC

Professional Code

(L.R.Q., c. C-26, a. 94, par. q)

1. A regular permit to practice medicine issued by the college of physicians of one of the provinces or territories of Canada and a specialist's certificate issued by the Royal College of Physicians and Surgeons of Canada, except for the specialist's certificate in family medicine, give access to the permit and the specialist's certificate issued by the Collège des médecins du Québec in one of the specialties mentioned in section 1 of the Regulation respecting medical specialties.
2. A regular permit to practice medicine issued by the college of physicians of one of the provinces or territories of Canada and a specialist's certificate in family medicine issued by the Royal College of Physicians and Surgeons of Canada, give access to the permit and the specialist's certificate in family medicine issued by the College of Family Physicians of Canada.

However, the holder of a regular permit to practice family medicine issued before 1994 is exempt from the obligation to hold a certificate in family medicine

3. To obtain a permit to practice medicine and a specialist's certificate, a candidate must:
 - (1) submit a written request to the secretary of the Collège des médecins;
 - (2) hold a regular permit to practice medicine, without restriction or limitation, in a Canadian province or territory;
 - (3) hold a certificate contemplated by sections 1 or 2 or has obtained, before 1994, a regular permit authorizing the practice of family medicine in Canada, as appropriate;
 - (4) attend the training on the legal, ethical and organizational aspects of the practice of medicine in Québec (ALDO-Québec);
 - (5) submit a recent attestation on his professional conduct signed by the competent authority;
 - (6) pay the fees for review of his record, prescribed pursuant to paragraph (8) of section 86.0.1 of the Professional Code (R.S.Q., c. C-26).

Moreover, he must provide the secretary with evidence that he satisfies the conditions stipulated in paragraphs (2) to (5) of the first paragraph.
